<u>1951</u>

Chung Chi College was founded with 63 students and about 10 teachers.



#### <u>1963</u>

CUHK was founded.

Chung Chi was incorporated as one of the three Founding Colleges of CUHK with 533 students and 67 teachers.



#### <u>Today</u>

3,145 students, 340 teachers and more than 29,000 alumni.

## **Project E: Another Milestone, New Development Opportunities**



Chung Chi College is redeveloping the staff quarters Block E into a twin-block complex.

The high block will be a student hostel with about 300 places, while the low block includes a replacement staff quarters (17,000 square feet), an alumni activity centre (2,200 square feet), a sky garden, Digital Culture and Art Creativity Centre (3,500 square feet), among others. It will be an important platform for students, academic staff, and alumni to gather, exchange, stimulate creativity and innovation, driving the campus development to reach a new milestone.

## **Introduction of Project E Facilities**

Promoting Chung Chi's educational mission and vision, Project E supports the long-term development of the College and the implementation of nurturing students with "Mastery of Both Academic and Athletics" (文武雙全), "Cultivation of Morality and Service Spirit" (德才兼備) and "Spirituality Enhancement" (靈性修為).



## **Student Hostel**

#### around 300 beds

Student Hostel is a crucial place to cultivate students' moral character and personal growth.

Hostel is a miniature of society. Through the social life in hostel, student residents can enhance their adaptability, emotional intelligence, interpersonal and communication skills, as well as sense of belongings to the College. The organization of hostel activities will also strengthen students' activity planning and execution skills, developing them into future-ready leaders.



## **Staff Quarters**

#### 17,000 square feet

Academic staff are students' role model. Their words, deeds, and experience sharing are part of non-formal education, which helps cultivate students' good character.



With a convenient accommodation, academic staff can actively participate in and promote College's activities, thereby, facilitating the communication and interaction between teachers and students, strengthening non-formal education, and establishing a harmonious campus atmosphere.

## **Alumni Activity Centre**

2,200 square feet



This centre, exclusively for Chung Chi Alumni, is located next to the University MTR station, which not only encourages alumni to visit their alma mater more but also bring alumni together to nurture Chung Chi students, passing on Chung Chi's spirit to future generations.

Alumni become students' companions with the College's mentor programme. Their life experience facilitates students to broaden their social network and enhance their communication skills. The Alumni Activity Centre will provide a platform for alumni and students to connect and exchange, establishing mentorship and friendship among them.

## **Digital Culture and Art Creativity Centre**

3,500 square feet

This new centre with a high ceiling will be a multi-functional space for various kinds of activities, exhibitions, workshops, and conferences on different themes.

It encourages students, academic staff, alumni, start-ups, and experts to engage in innovation and creativity, facilitating cultural and artistic interaction in the global digital world, fostering the digital literacy among the new generation, including digital ethics and digital citizenship, and promoting the creation and appreciation of digital culture and art.

The centre will build an atmosphere for studying digital art culture, cultivating students' cultural enrichment, encouraging them to self-learn, unleash innovation and creativity. Through gathering teachers, students and alumni to interact and collide, students' ability in communication, critical thinking and problem-solving could be greatly enhanced.





The construction cost is estimated to be \$550 million. With a government subsidy of \$200 million for the partial construction cost of the student hostel, the rest will be financed by the College and fundraising.

Since the Government's subsidy to the eight UGC-funded Universities are mainly for academic development, recurrent expenditure on teaching and research purposes, only the student hostel of Project E will be subsidized partially by the Government. Without other financial support from the Government or CUHK, the College is bearing the construction cost for the remaining facilities independently.

The Finance Committee of College Board agreed to contribute with a matching fund of \$100 million, together with \$70 million from College Staff Quarters Fund, of which the current project fund is \$370 million in total. The remaining \$180 million has to be raised through donations from Chung Chi-ers and the public.

Facilities of Project E, including but not limited to the two new blocks, student hostel, staff quarter, alumni activity centre, Digital Culture and Art Creativity Centre, sky garden, are available for pledge. A feature wall will be installed in the new building to engrave donors' names for appreciation.


